

Notice of Amendment of Statement of Claim – IKO Class Action Litigation

To: Persons who own or owned a house or other building upon which IKO asphalt roofing shingles were installed between 1979 and present.

Please read this notice carefully as it might affect your legal rights.

Class actions have been commenced in Ontario and Alberta on behalf of all Canadian residents concerning IKO asphalt roofing shingles.

The Ontario court has approved amendments to the Statement of Claim that limit the parameters of the litigation to include only IKO asphalt organic roofing shingles. IKO asphalt organic roofing shingles were sold under various brand and product names including but not limited to Chateau, Renaissance XL, Aristocrat, Total, Armour Seal, Superplus, Armour Lock, Royal Victorian, Cathedral XL, Ultralock 25, Armour Plus 20, Armour Tite, Chateau Ultra Shadow (laminated organic), and Cathedral XL, Crowne 30.

If you seek to claim in respect of shingles other than IKO asphalt organic roofing shingles, you should be aware that there could be time limits within which to commence legal action. If you miss the time limit to start legal action, your claims could be barred with no legal right to recovery. A class action will suspend the running of the time limit. Since shingles other than IKO asphalt organic roofing shingles will not be the subject of a class action claim, any applicable limitation period or time limit to commence legal action is running. If you are contemplating starting an action in court, it is important that you be aware of any limitation period and contact a lawyer for advice.
